

Finally, they won a classic battle with Cherry Hill West at Kean University on Sunday, 11/13. The game ended in a 3-3 tie in regulation and 2 Overtime periods. On Penalty Kicks, Po prevailed 6-5!!! They are Group 3 State Champions!!!! Outstanding!!! The team finished 19-3 and is currently ranked #7 in NJ.
